sold for parts, McKay's novel explores the heritage of slavery amid an unforgiving modern economy. This first-ever edition of *Romance in Marseille* includes an introduction by McKay scholars Gary Edward Holcomb and William J. Maxwell that places the novel within both the "stowaway era" of black cultural politics and McKay's challenging career as a star and skeptic of the Harlem Renaissance.
